Discover Desert Sage Library

If <u>Desert Sage</u> is not your local Phoenix Public Library branch (yet), allow us to introduce you!

Located south of the Desert Sky Mall on Encanto Boulevard and just west of 75th Ave., Desert Sage Library offers special collections of large print and Spanish-language materials and provides an EV Charging station, in addition to the full range of library services and resources.

Opening its doors in July of 1997, Desert Sage is Phoenix Public Library's 12th location and throughout its almost 30 year history, has been known for its strong connections with its communities. Desert Sage Library welcomes over 4,000 visits a month, and this library's users don't just drop in, they tend to come in and spend some quality time.





Visitors browse the shelves, apply for jobs on a computer, create or polish up a resume with staff assistance, complete their tax returns through the V.I.T.A. program, visit "Cirrus Circus" a George Peters public art installation, or improve their English skills with Desert Sage's ESL program (created at Desert Sage and now offered at additional Phoenix Public Library locations).

Desert Sage circulates almost 5,000 items a month; one of their most popular collections is their Spanish fotonovella collection. Staff share they often hear gratitude from parents for how the library helps them help their kids. Desert Sage's collection includes a large number of Dav Pilkey's *Dog Man* books in both English and Spanish. When kids come in looking for a book for a book report assignment, families often check out a *Dog Man* book in both languages. Parents are able to use the books to have shared reading moments, practice their English and help their kids with homework.



"I love seeing the excitement on kids' faces when they come to the library for the first time, when they see their little friends at storytime, or when we do a fun STEM or craft activity. Desert Sage Library doesn't just wait for people to come in the doors, they also take the library out to their community. Known as a "library outreach powerhouse", Desert Sage staff visit kids in classrooms, are on hand at parent-teacher and literacy nights at neighboring schools, bring books and library materials to senior centers, and connect all ages to what this library has to offer at community centers and events.



Desert Sage staff are known for creating programing that is picked up and offered at other Phoenix Public Library locations. Almost 150 kids complete Desert Sage's popular monthly "Library Scavenger Hunt". Last fall's butterfly "Family Fun" program which explored the life cycle of butterflies from caterpillar, through chrysalis, into the adult butterfly stage and culminating in a big release of Painted Lady butterflies is back by popular demand.


